Summer Camp!

The 2017 summer camp season is around the corner and registration is open for the dozens of camping programs available.

Each of the four summer camp centers serve a diverse population, including rural, urban, and suburban, while offering opportunities to connect with God's creation, with a loving Christian community, and with friends, new and old. Aldersgate is set in the tall pines of the Adirondacks. They offer various programs June 25-30 with traditional camp activities like swimming, boating, crafts, archery, and more. They also have a Beginnings program for the first-time camper ages 6-9 July 2-5, a one-day adventure for children ages 4-8 on July 8 and a family life weekend July 7-9.

Skye Farm, also in the Adirondacks, is on Sherman Lake, with programs May, July, and August. They offer traditional camp favorites like arts and crafts, volleyball, hiking, and



several unique activities like High Peak Adventures, whitewater rafting, and care of farm animals. They have a "Camp Nostalgia" program for adults Aug. 20-Aug. 23 and a family camp May 26-29.

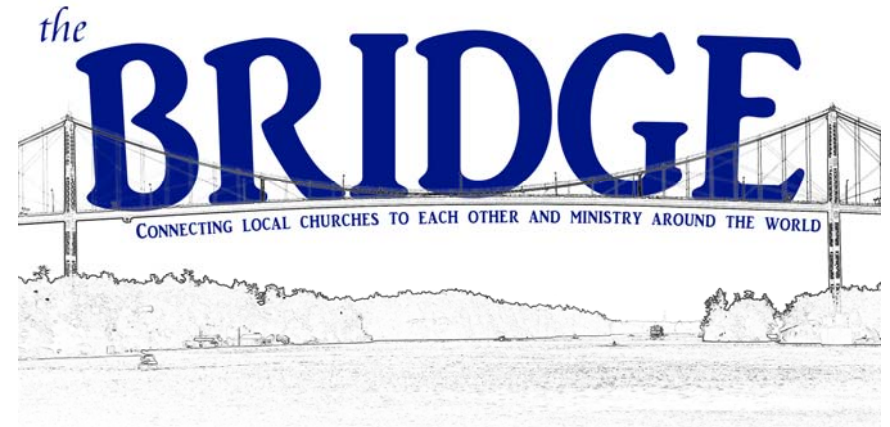
Casowasco is located in the heart of the Finger Lakes region. They offer many programs throughout July and August, from horseback riding-specific and swimming-specific to musical programs and extreme sports. They also have a Father-Son program, a Mother-Daughter program, and a family camp all offered August 13-16.

Sky Lake sits atop the Tuscora Mountain, southeast of Binghamton. They offer a variety of programs throughout July and August, including classic camping experiences, programs specific to the arts, outdoor exploring, swimming, and camp experiences for those with special needs.

The week of March 20, the Upper New York Conference office, the Upper New York Episcopal Office, and the Crossroads District Office will be moving to the new United Methodist Center of Upper New York at 7481 Henry Clay Blvd in Liverpool, N.Y. 13088. Soon thereafter, the Media Resource Center will move from Endicott, N.Y. to the new United Methodist Center, and Archives and History will bring the documents, artifacts, and informational pieces that had been stored all over the state to that single location.

On Wednesday May 31, the day before the 2017 Upper New York Annual Conference, the doors of the United Methodist Center will be open for all from 3:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. The Open

Annual Conference 2017

In the United Methodist tradition, the term Annual Conference can refer to a regional body or a yearly meeting. We are the Upper New York (Annual) Conference and our Annual Conference meeting takes place in June every year.

This year the Annual Conference will be held June 1-3 at the Oncenter in Syracuse.

Each year, an equal number of clergy members and lay members attend this Annual Conference session for worship, fellowship, and to conduct the business of the Conference. The Conference, presided by Upper New York Area Resident Bishop Mark J. Webb, includes reports of past and ongoing work; adoption of future goals, programs, and budgets; ordination of clergy members as deacons and elders; and election of delegates to Jurisdictional and General Conferences (every 4 years).
