As Church Conferences wrap up we realize there is still some confusion around the new CLM process. Please see the CLM Process attachment for an outline of the process. Just a reminder that before someone can officially become a CLM they must first be a Lay Servant (voted on at a previous church conference). They must also meet with dCOM and have final approval through the Conference Team on Lay Servant ministries.

For more information, come to one of the workshops at Catch the Spirit regarding Lay Servant Ministries (see descriptions below). Lucina Hallagan, the Conference Director of Lay Servant Ministries, will be there to help

answer all of your questions.

~ Safe Sanctuary Training ~



Who needs to take Safe Sanctuary training?

- A person only needs to take the Basic Training class one time.
- Each church should be offering a yearly update for anyone involved in ministries whether they have taken the basic training or not. Example: There are those involved in VBS who may not have completed the basic training. The update would be important for them. The update can be specific to your church's policy and procedure or the ministry the individual is involved in. It might be "how to keep a special needs child safe at Sunday School."
- Only a Certified Trainer may teach the Basic Course. However, anyone who has taken the Basic Course may lead an update class.

There is only one box of training materials for the Basic Course. Please contact Julie in the District Office to clear the date you want to have that course to make sure the materials are available and arrange to pick them up! Julie also has a list of certified trainers to help you find someone to lead the course.

Basic Course will be offered at Amherst: Trinity (711 Niagara Falls Blvd., Amherst) on Saturday, March 30 from 10am-1pm. Space is limited so you must pre-register by March 23. Contact Pastor Jean Edmister at pastorjeane@juno.com if you have questions or want to register.

(2/1) **UNY BOM endorses 2019 Shenandoah University Youth Theology Institute** — The Upper New York Conference's Board of Ordained Ministry has endorsed this summer's <u>Shenandoah University Youth Theology Institute</u> (SUYTI), a 14-day institute (July 14-27, 2019) where high school students explore the exciting intersection of faith

and justice. Upon completion of the institute and a self-identified justice project in their local context students receive 3 college credits from Shenandoah University. At SUYTI, students spend one week at Shenandoah University in Winchester, VA and one week at Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington D.C. Both Shenandoah and Wesley are United -Methodist-related schools. Each day includes worship, class time with world-class professors, compelling afternoon immersive experiences, and mentoring from undergraduate and seminary students.
