BASIC TRAINING IN FAMILY SYSTEMS THEORY

Although many professionals are familiar with the benefits of "systems thinking," few have received an in-depth explanation of the theory behind the family systems movement.

Developed in the latter half of the twentieth century by health care professionals who were no longer satisfied with the diagnose-and-prescribe "medical model," Family Systems Theory began to address human psychology in terms of a multigenerational family instead of a defective individual.

At the forefront of the movement was psychiatrist Murray Bowen, MD, who proposed a series of eight interlocking principles now known as Family Systems Theory or Bowen Theory.

This new way of thinking encourages people to accept more individual responsibility and avoid blaming others for life's problems.
