“The Basic Lay Servant Course”**

The Basic Lay Servant Course is an overview study and exploration into the many ways Christians may serve our Lord through Lay Servant Ministries. It is the foundation course for Lay Servant Ministries. Participants are invited to consider the importance of exercising servant leadership, developing future leaders, remaining rooted in consistent spiritual practices, and being part of a group that holds members accountable in discipleship. It offers guidelines for best practices as a church leader and outlines a number of ministries in which Lay Servants may assume roles. Whether one decides to proceed in the process to become a Lay Servant or not, this course is excellent for all church laity in leadership positions. “Conversations with God” will be more of an experiential retreat than an academic class, when we will look at our own prayer understandings and practices, and how we lead others in prayer as congregational leaders.

Instructor: Rev. Margaret Scott is a retired (sort of) Pastor of GV District, an explorer of life with the Spirit, and a midwife for others’. She is co-leader of *Revs on Retreat*, a ministry resourcing the spiritual life through short retreat experiences and educational presentations.

This course will explore the special gifts of theology, witness, and organization that The United Methodist Church brings to the church universal, how we got where we are today, and how our distinctive emphases are still needed in the 21st-century church.

Instructor: Dr. Greg Van Dussen is an adjunct professor at Northeastern Seminary on the campus of Roberts Wesleyan College, where he has taught Worship and Celtic Spirituality. He is a retired member of the Upper NY Conference where he served several churches and was Superintendent of the former Batavia District. Greg has written four books, three of which deal with early Methodist circuit riders in North America. He is currently working on a study of Methodist camp meetings and their relevance to the future of the Wesleyan movement. Earlier he taught Irish and American History at the College at Brockport. He is an active participant in the Indian Falls UMC. Greg and his wife Jackie live in Batavia. He has special interests in coffee and conversation, Celtic and North American traditional music, reading, travel, and gardening.

Who Should Take The Advanced Courses?

Primarily aimed at Lay Servants, these classes are open to anyone (clergy or laity). Lay Servants may use these courses to fulfill the requirement of at least one advanced /refresher course, each three years, to maintain status.
