in your Community



At the center of all mission is bringing God's love to our communities! If you are looking for new mission ideas to try this summer, be intentional about your relationship building and hospitality.

Here are a few summer mission opportunities you can try this summer :

Community Swap

Host a one day, free, swap of specific items. This can be children's toys, puzzles, seeds, clothing, sports equipment - or really, anything!

Farmers Market Table

Buy a summer slot at your community farmers market. Churches have used this opportunity to create relationships in the community, provide activities for children, or bring their ongoing mission into the community (free diapers, food, laundry packets, pet food)

Sponsor Free Laundry

Connect with your community laundromat to sponsor a night of free laundry. Collect coins and laundry pods in church the month beforehand. Connect with the laundromat to see how you can turn the laundromat into a hospitable space for that night with conversation, activities for children, or music.

Build a Ramp

If your church has a few people who have the gift of construction, connect with local organizations, like Office for the Aging, to see if they have any families needing a ramp. Many times there are long lists for ramps and not enough resources to supply them all.

Free Haircuts

Partner with a local hairdresser to sponsor free haircuts in the park. This is especially great for back to school. For extra fun, add in activities or other resources from community organizations. Make it a goal to bring the energy and fun of a block party!


