
The Commission on the Status and Role of Women (COSROW) advocates for the full and equal participation of women in the total life and mission of the Church. The four key goals of the Commission are to provide sexual ethics resources, monitor conferences, create trainings, and support women in leadership positions. Below are this Conference's COSROW findings from monitoring the special session of Annual Conference held on Zoom on October 14, 2023.




There were 603 registrants for the October Special Session, a steep decline from the 917 registrants for the June session. Of the registrants, 338 identified as female, 261 identified as male, and 4 identified as nonbinary. There was an even split between clergy and laity (Appendix A). Over 90% of registrants identified as white (Appendix B). While we do not ask speakers to identify their age when they speak on the floor of

Annual Conference, it was a required field at registration. Over 97% of registrants were over the age of 35 with 16 young adult and 0 youth registrants (Appendix C).

There were 10 unique speakers during the Special Session. Half of the speakers did not provide

any of their demographics (Appendix D). Three speakers identified as women. There were three clergy and two laity identified speakers (Appendix E). In line with registration numbers, more speakers identified as white than any other race (Appendix F).





origin of the Upper New York Annual Conference and that all reports are published on the Conference's website in an accessible fashion by the end of the calendar year.



Membership status of October 2023 Registrants





Age of October 2023 Registrants




