1- Lay Servant Course (Part 1 of 2)

Presenter Rev. James Brown

A 10 hour course is required in the 2016 Book of Discipline for anyone who would like to become a Lay Servant at their church as listed in the new 2016 Book of Discipline. This class is the first four hours, followed by an **additional six hour class** to be held at Asbury UMC, 850 Dodge Road, Amherst (just off Millersport Highway) on March 18. *All students in this class must complete both classes (CTS and Asbury) to receive credit for the required 10 hours.* There is a required book, *Lay Servants Ministries Basic Course Participant,* (ISBN-10 0881776262) and can be purchased at <u>WWW.cokesbury.com. *Please read chapters 1 and 2 prior to coming to this class*.</u>

2- Conflict Transformation Skills for Church

Presenter Rev. Dr. Wilson Jones

This 10 hour workshop uses biblical accounts, personal exploration and role playing to help transform each individual's understanding of conflict and the part it plays in congregational life. Church leaders will gain perspective in the midst of current conflict and/or prepare to better manage themselves when conflict does occur. *This qualifies as an Advanced Lay Servants Course*. Topics covered include:

- The Nature and Role of Conflict
- Conflict in the New Testament
- Understanding and Improving Your Own Response to Conflict
- Interpersonal Peacemaking Skills: How To Stay Cool When Others Are Hot
- Congregational Conflict: Understanding Group Conflict and Ways to Manage It

Participants must purchase (through presenter) two resources that will be distributed at the workshop. Attendees will also need to attend an additional six hour session on March 4 (location to be determined). <u>Materials Cost (in addition to CTS registration)</u> is \$30.

3-Learning to Prepare a Sermon That Is More Than "Good"

This workshop is intended for those who want to expand their skills and techniques in the art of developing a sermon for publication or presentation. Participants will have the opportunity to walk through a series of significant steps each contributing to a well-developed, theologically sound and biblically based sermon. Beginning with an idea and/or scripture text, participants will learn and then apply what they have learned by beginning to develop a sermon as each step is taken. 5-God's Rescue Mission: A Wesleyan Look at Predestination Presenter Rev. Dr. Greg Van Dussen

The doctrine of predestination says that God decided before creation that some people would be saved and others condemned. Nothing can change that pre-determined outcome. Therefore, Christ died *only* for those destined for salvation. Everyone else is without hope. John Wesley and his followers staunchly opposed this teaching, saying instead that God wants *all* people to be saved, that Christ died for *all*, that *all* can be saved, and that we can *know* we are saved. Today's resurgence of Reformed/Calvinist theology has made this a live issue among Christians in our own time. We will explore the reasons Wesley opposed the idea of predestination, and how we can be sure that God does indeed love everyone. I will have copies available of Jerry Walls' book, *Does God Love Everyone?* These do not have to be purchased prior to CTS. Cost of the book is \$14.

7- Volunteers In Mission: Disciples
