Rush United Methodist Church Director of Youth Ministry Expectations & Responsibilities

The mission of the Rush United Methodist Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world and to be God's love to our neighbors in all places.

As a minimum, the director of youth ministries needs to demonstrate the following:

A personal commitment to Jesus Christ as Savior and a heartfelt desire to serve youth in the United Methodist Church.

A strong sense of calling to ministry with youth An ability to recruit, train and work with adult volunteers Ability to plan, organize, lead and guide the various projects and activities related to youth ministry

Willingness and ability to work cooperatively with others, a positive and flexible outlook and willingness to share in problem solving

Weekly worship attendance, participation and occasional preaching/leadership on Sunday mornings at Rush UMC

Willingness and ability to be a supportive presence in the schools/communities where youth are active and engaged

Help to coordinate at least annual youth led worship services

Willingness to support and encourage participation in United Methodist Youth activities and events, in the district, conference and beyond.

Required:

Satisfactory background check

Minimum age of 22 to satisfy the United Methodist Safe Sanctuary policy

Compensation: \$31,000 annual; this compensation can be divided into categories such as cash salary, professional expense reimbursement, housing, benefits, but will not exceed \$31,000 at this time.

<u>Principle Duties and Responsibilities</u>

Plan, conduct, coordinate and lead Rush UMC's ministry with youth Build relationships of depth and integrity with youth as possible in large group, small group and individual settings

Work with director of Sunday School to develop and implement a plan for middle and high school Sunday school classes

Coordinate all aspects of grades 6-12 youth group, developing opportunities for relationship development, discipleship formation, and an experience of Christian community

Lead and maintain participation in the Youth Council (a group of adults and youth who oversee and support youth ministry at RUMC)

Meet regularly with pastoral staff for visioning, accountability and support.

Attend staff meetings when/if possible

Attend Leadership Team meetings as needed or requested

Work with the Finance Ministry Team to assure financial care, support and accountability around use and availability of funds for youth ministry

Prepare budget and funding requests in a timely manner so that the entire congregation can adequately support and encourage effective youth ministry. Plan and lead an annual youth experience away from the church. This may be a mission trip, retreat experience or something comparable. This would include recruitment of adequate adult supervision, fund raising and strict adherence to safe sanctuary policies.

Staff Relationships:

If hired rather than appointed, the youth director is hired by the Staff Parish Relations Committee/Leadership Team

The Youth Director shall perform the above responsibilities under the direction and supervision of the Lead Pastor

The Youth Director shall meet with the Lead Pastor for clarification of the vision for this ministry, strategic planning, and for guidance, prayer and support. The Youth Director shall be evaluated annually by the Lead Pastor, with input from the Staff Parish Relations Committee and Youth Council
