# Words from Nancy # 37

Hi, Friends.

Allow me to take a few moments to reflect on Annual Conference, which just concluded on Saturday. The fellowship of Conference is rich – seeing old friends and making new ones. My seminary roommate presented me with a small bag of M&Ms everyday! She knows me well!

As always, Bishop Webb's sermon for opening worship was a stirring call to action, reminding us of the promise of harvest. One of the stories of harvest that was celebrated was from our own Angelica UMC. Keep up the good work!

We were also reminded of Mary's response to the angel Gabriel, when she heard that she would bear the Savior of the world: "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." What if we earnestly prayed Mary's response every day, as we listen attentively for that word (Word)? What would it mean if we remembered each day that like Mary, we are all called to be Christ-bearers in the world and on the Mountain View District?

Bishop Devadhar's Bible study on the Lord's Prayer challenged us with these and other questions: "Do we live the Lord's prayer?" Do we hallow God's name in every situation and decision? I believe the following was from an Amish source: "We cannot pray `Thy kingdom come,' until we pray, `My kingdom go.'" Ouch... Important words to ponder... What a marvelous witness it was that the Upper New York Annual Conference elected so many youth and young adults to be delegates to General and Jurisdictional Conference in 2016! Thanks be to God for these young disciples of Jesus Christ who are willing to serve in this way!

As always, the service of commissioning and ordination was exciting. Congratulations to the Rev. Chad Sayers, pastor of Caton UMC on our district, who is newly commissioned as a provisional elder. We rejoice with you and are proud of you, Chad! It is overwhelming to me as I witness those who respond to the Bishop's altar call each year – and it's not just to pastoral ministry that the people are responding. I had the privilege of praying with a woman who responded because God is calling her to join her church's visitation ministry. Awesome!

A comment was made publicly at Conference, de-valuing the role and call of licensed local pastors. Something I want to make sure you understand is that I value the ministry of ALL the pastors! I've said this

countless times, and I will say it again: The highest calling any of us has is to do what God is calling us to do – whether lay or clergy. May each of us continue to respond in joyful obedience to God's call on our lives.
