Is your name Barnabas? What? Is your name Barnabas? We first meet Barnabas in Acts 4:36 and many passages in Acts and some other New Testament books as well. Barnabas means "Son of Encouragement." Barnabas plays a major role with Saul and then Paul. Barnabas encouraged Paul and others along the way. His wisdom was helpful on many occasions, and when Paul and Barnabas disagreed about John Mark, Barnabas took John Mark under his tutelage and encouragement, while Paul decided to go with Silas.

Is your name Barnabas? Who is God calling you to encourage? A colleague of mine on the Cabinet greatly encouraged me yesterday by taking the time to listen to me, and saying that he would pray about a situation, and I have no doubt that he will – and that he already has! Two others

greatly encouraged me yesterday, and probably don't even know that. I need to tell them, and I will.

May each of us be a Barnabas to those around us who are discouraged, depressed, hopeless, down-trodden, hurting, despairing, abused, etc. It's important to note that Barnabas was not a "pie in the sky by and by, everything's going to be fine" kind of encourager. Frankly, I don't think that's being encouraging at all. Barnabas came beside people, gave people a chance that others wouldn't, including Paul and John Mark. I dare say his encouragement played no small role in their lives and ministries, thereby touching countless lives – and all to the glory of God. May each of us follow the example of Barnabas in living out our Christian discipleship by encouraging those around us.

So friends, to whom is God calling you this week and in the weeks to come to be a Barnabas?
