Hi, Friends.

Is life ever overwhelming for you? What - are you kidding, Nance? Perhaps you need to hear the passage that I need to hear about now, from Matthew 11:28-30. Hear the words of Jesus: "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Isn't that a wonderful invitation? That's an invitation I cannot refuse. Can you? When Jesus says his yoke is easy, the Greek for "easy" means "well-fitting." There's an oxen yoke over the bulletin board in my office that reminds me of this passage, and Jesus' well-fitting yoke. The yoke is made for two. If one wears a yoke alone that was made for two, one will be weighed down and unable to do the work he or she has been called by God to do. The concept of the yoke is that Jesus and the Christian work side by side. I shared this with a group recently, and wanted to share it with you, as I am certain we all need to be reminded of this blessed truth. The yoke, when worn as it was intended, is not confining, but rather freeing, since Jesus is there right beside us every step of the journey.

Blessings on you as with Christ, you - and we - continue to do the work we have been called by our Lord to do.
