Boehm's Chapel To Host Francis Asbury

The Boehm's Chapel Society will host **Peyton Dixon** who will portray Bishop Francis Asbury at its Heritage Sunday on June 26, 2022.

The event starts at 3 p.m. with the Society's business meeting. The Asbury reenactment will

follow at about 3:30 p.m. In 2021, Dixon (shown at right) appeared at Historic St. George's Church in Philadelphia to commemorate the 250th anniversary of Bishop Francis Asbury's arrival in America.

Boehm's Chapel, in Willow Street, south of Lancaster, PA was built in 1791, and is the fourth oldest place of Methodist worship still standing in the country.
