Rev. Barnhart said, “The very nature of discipleship means engagement...we can’t do that by ourselves; we need community. And we can’t do that just by watching an online worship service. So, we have a House Church that meets by Zoom every Wednesday night. We worship together, pray together, and hear a message together and then we reflect together on how God is speaking to us through the scripture. We make commitments for action and hold each other accountable prayerfully.”



Using the tools available to grow discipleship digitally

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Using the tools available to grow discipleship digitally

Since the start of the COVID pandemic last March, clergy and members of churches throughout the world have leaped out of their comfort zones into the world of digital ministry. Many churches in the Upper New York Conference developed websites and a social media presence, began livestreaming worship services, created online giving options, and started having small group meetings on Zoom.

This fall, the Upper New York Conference is offering trainings by three church leaders who have successfully increased discipleship at their church by connecting with others online.

Online Giving

The Rev. B.J. Norrix, Lead Pastor of the Syracuse United Methodist Minis-

tries and pastor at Erwin First UMC and Brown Memorial UMC uses Tithe.ly, an online giving platform to increase giving at Erwin First UMC.

Rev. Norrix said, "At Erwin First, we adapted the Tithe.ly online platform last year, but didn't use it very much; occasionally somebody would make a contribution. Since we had to go live online beginning in the middle of March, we have been intentionally emphasizing this giving option.

We say to folks in every service, 'Go to our website at Erwinfirstchurch.org and find the Give to Erwin button; push that and follow directions.' We saw an immediate increase in giving from people who have not previously pledged."

Lori Jagow is the online minister at Pendleton Center UMC. She is using Facebook to increase discipleship at her church.

Lori explains how Pendleton started using Facebook more heavily at the beginning of the pandemic; she said, "We have found an incredible amount of success with increasing our reach using Facebook. We have even seen up

to a 13,000 reach with one post."
