Greetings to all of you on behalf of your Conference staff! We sincerely hope that you are well and have the blessings of a church community to worship and prepare for the celebration of our Lord's birth this Christmas. I am writing to remind you of a few end-of-year items:

Addresses: Our office maintains the address database for all clergy and surviving spouses, including the addresses used by Wespeth Benefits and Investments and our health insurance programs. Housing Exclusion: As you know, each year the Annual Conference approves a resolution that states that retired clergy pension or clergy disability income paid by the UMC is excluded from federal income tax (up to IRS limits). Simply put, the federal limits are the lesser of:

1. The amount of church-related pension received.
2. The amount spent on housing, items purchased to maintain the home and utilities.
3. The fair rental value of your home including furnishings and utilities.

The Resolution is updated on the website for your use for filing 2025 income taxes. Surviving spouses, that are not clergy themselves, are not eligible to take the clergy retiree housing exclusion.

1099R: Wespeth Benefits and Investments is responsible for issuing the 1099R forms which provide you with your pension income information. Please call Wespeth (800-851-2201) if you do not receive the 1099R by the end of the first week in February.

Retiree/Disabled Clergy Emergency Fund: The UNY Board of Pension & Health Benefits may be able to offer an emergency grant to those who unexpectedly find themselves in need. The purpose of this emergency fund is to provide financial assistance to Retired Clergy, Clergy on Medical Leave, and Surviving Spouses for unexpected expenses that place a burden on the applicant. To qualify, the applicant's total household income must fall below the minimum salary level established for local pastors. The minimum total income amounts for 2026 are \$41,273 for retired/disabled clergy and \$30,955 for surviving spouses. If your household falls below that income level, you may request a grant. The amount of individual grants is determined by the number of eligible requests and the funds available. Individual grants are not to exceed \$5,000 per year and no individual shall receive more than \$20,000 in lifetime grants.
